Bendigo Junior members:

A range of great benefits have flowed from the programs running in these states and Bendigo Orienteers are fortunate to be in a position to consider doing this also.

Financial management:

Club members with an interest in financial management are invited to join the club's Finance Sub-Committee (Daryl, Andrew, Ben, Richard). One of the Sub-committee's first recommendations to be endorsed to help the Committee implement best practice governance, is to establish 'passing accounts for payment'. 
Embargo:
