Minutes of the 2016 AGM were accepted. Moved: Jason Carter, seconded: John Wilkinson

Motions from last month's committee meeting were raised again, and formally ratified by the club:

1. That Bendigo Orienteers set its membership fees for 2017 to \$15 per senior member and \$1 per junior member (under 21yo).

Additional OV fees have been set at \$35 and \$6 for senior and junior respectively, making a total payable of \$50 and \$7.

2. That Bendigo Orienteers change the scheduling of its AGM to the end of the calendar year, in line with its annual membership term.

This is to allow for decisions that need to be made early (eg, fees) to be formally passed at the AGM in a timely manner.

3. That Bendigo Orienteers raise its event entry fees by \$2 for local events in order to cover the increased event permit fee and OV levies increases.

Parks Victoria have charged the club more than \$1000 in event permits for 2017, which equates to approximately \$1.50 per person per event. Orienteering Victoria charge a \$2.85 levy per person per event. The club has absorbed levy increases for the last few years, but levies now account for 40% of our event income, whereas 7 years ago it was only 15%.

The new entry fees will be \$10 for senior entry and \$5 for junior entry. Non members will be \$18 and \$6 respectively. Members from other orienteering clubs are the same as BGV. Park & Street Challenge events will continue to have no entry fee.
