And another Note for Course Organisers


The water tank on the trailer can now be drained. 



Bryan Keely laid low by injury after winning selection for the WOC team



Bryan was selected for the National WOC team! He clinched his selection with the fastest Australian run in the Long Distance selection race at Newcastle.

Its been many years since the era when Bendigo orienteers Jim and Eddie Wymer regularly represented Australia at World Championships. Lets hope Bryan's breakthrough heralds a new era of regular appearances by Bendigo orienteers in Australian teams, not least because injury will prevent Bryan competing this year.


A stress fracture has halted his running and there was little likelihood it would recover in time for the World Championship. Bryan had the same misfortune after winning selection for the Australian Junior team. I am sure we all wish him well in his recovery and hope he solves the problem before next selection season.

Interstate travellers: A couple of local orienteers decided to take a couple of extra days leave and spend the Queens Birthday weekend orienteering in the spur gully terrain of the Flinders Ranges. Three events on offer included the South Australian Night and Middle Championships. One Bendigo local has apparently been convinced that despite years of accurate navigation in local Bendigo events, he still does not really know how to navigate in spur gully terrain. 
Overseas travellers:

Four Bendigo orienteers are touring the season of orienteering events in Europe. At the time of writing, Jim, Laurinna, Evan and Ilka are overseas or about to leave. Between them they will compete in a very interesting assortment of races and terrains. Younger runners will be at the World University Championships on the east coast of Spain. Your correspondent believes only Jim will be running at the World Masters Championship in Germany. Other events on the list of our absent foursome include the Croatian Open in complex limestone depression country, Tallin O-week in Estonian glacial country, World Cup races in Switzerland, O-Ringen in Halland Sweden, and this coming weekend (17 July) the two big relay events near Helsinki in Finland - Venla and Jukola. For the first time ever, there is an all Australian team in both events. And there is a Bendigo runner in both teams.
