1. Minutes of Previous Committee Meeting

2. Correspondence IN (Prue)

- Email from OA (Paul Prudhoe) with information on Eventor improvements for casual entry. No immediate action required.
- Request from Sophie Taverner (CHOC), course setter for a Mt Tarrengower event, requesting Eventor access be given to CHOC to plan the courses.
 Action: Make CHOC the organiser of the event - Craig (completed).
- Request from Mt Korong Eco-Watch (Kate) for an email in support of Mount Korong Eco-Watch for an AGVIC PAPs (Partnerships against Pests) grant to purchase a set of cactus stabbing equipment. Also thanks to the club for cactus control works undertaken to date. Neil referred the decision to the meeting, but by the date of the meeting the time had passed. However, Neil had given some informal words that could be used. In the future the committee will make out-of-session decisions on time-specific matters such as this.
- Request from Victory Christian College asking for the club to run two orienteering sessions for the Year 8 AddVenture Class (on August 7 and 15 from 12pm to 1pm). Prue sent an email to club members asking for volunteers but received no replies. An email was sent to the college asking if there was any flexibility in these dates but no response was received. After consultation with the President, an email was sent to the college apologising that the club was unable to help on those dates.

Jim commented that school sessions were easy to run, were paid, and club members should be encouraged to run these. The club has three sets of controls and manual timing can be used.

- Request through Dropbox from Peter Thompson to access the "Diamond Hill South.ocd" map. Committee members were asked if they knew this person, but did not, and the request was deleted on the advice of the President.
- Request from Clare Brownridge (President MFR) asking clubs if they had a policy/guidelines for reimbursing volunteers for travel (or any other kind of volunteer recognition policy). Prue requested information from the club committee and Craig (Treasurer) advised that Bendigo Orienteers pay the standard travel 'tax rate' for event organisers if they requested it. However, more often than not, no one has requested the reimbursement unless it was a distant event like Korong or Kooyoora. A free event entry form or course setters was found and it was suggested some course organisers may not know about these benefits.

Action: Advertise travel reimbursement and a free event entry for course setters when seeking volunteers for next year. Craig put this information on the organiser's list.
