When I'm not orienteering - John Wilkinson

I have been asked by the editors to write an article on what I do when not orienteering. Well I have been fortunate enough to have a number of things to keep me busy after retiring as a science educator/ teacher some 13 years ago.

Since I was a teenager my hobby was astronomy and I have been active in studying the stars, sun and moon ever since. I spend a lot of time photographing the sun during the daytime and deep sky objects at night. I have three telescopes, two used to study the sun and a large 10 inch scope used to study the night sky. There is a photo of my observatory (which houses my largest scope). This telescope is fully computerised with GPS so it is able to locate any object in the night sky and track it. I have a Canon Ra camera that attaches to the telescope to record images of the objects. I process all of the photographs I take digitally on computer.

I write articles for a number of astronomy journals and use my own photographs in these articles. My main interest is in monitoring the 11 year solar sunspot cycle and solar flares. The sun is interesting because it has a large influence on earth's climate and communications.

I am also author of over 100 science textbooks, five of which are on Astronomy. I don't write textbooks anymore but they are still an interest of mine and provide much enjoyment in my spare time. I am also a motor car enthusiast and used to take part in motor car rallies and other motoring events.
