Wheel Cactus day (Report by Julie Flynn).

Four of our orienteering club members participated in our first wheel cactus day at the Granites. We were joined by several volunteers from the Loddon Plains Landcare Network and 2 staff members from Parks Victoria. When Neil mapped the area for orienteering, he included the locations of the wheel cactus plants. We can use these maps to help us cover the whole area and eventually eliminate the weeds from the reserve.



The purpose of our involvement was to start a process of (hopefully) regular working bees to poison these nasty weeds so that we have better orienteering terrain and earn respect from Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Corporation and Parks Victoria, which provides permits for us to use the land they manage for our sport.
