
# Bendigo Orienteers

Will we get to 100 by the end of the year? Welcome to new members.



### Livelox an update from Neil Barr.

Bendigo Orienteers has reactivated a club subscription to Livelox. Livelox is a web site that allows members of Bendigo Orienteers Inc. to draw their route or upload their route so viewers can compare the navigation of orienteers. You can look at the routes orienteers have taken on each leg or the course as a whole. You can replay some legs (speed up of course) to see when you were overtaken or when you overtook someone else. The club subscription gives you access to all routes for Bendigo events. [For events organised by other clubs you will be limited to viewing one runner at a time unless you purchase a personal subscription or the club has purchased a universal subscription for the event]. The easiest link to Livelox is the red circular arrow symbol next to the results symbol on the Eventor listing for each Bendigo event.

Livelox is a handy tool for orienteers to assess their navigation and learn from the navigation of others. It is an even handier tool for course setters to see whether their course planning worked as they expected. Below is an interesting example from the Lyell Forest event set by Colin Walker. Eight orienteers uploaded their GPS track to course 2. None made a mistake on the first long leg to control 2. Most made an error on the next long leg to control 4. For the course setter the question is – why the difference? For the orienteer the question might be – how could I learn from those who didn't make a mistake?



I encourage everyone who runs with a GPS watch to upload their tracks to Livelox. The more that do this, the better value we all get from the service. If you use a Garmin watch, you can configure Livelox to automatically upload your route from the Garmin Connect web site. For those without a GPS watch, you can draw your track, and if SI timing has been used, Livelox will combine the SI times at controls with your hand drawn route. Even if you haven't uploaded to Livelox,

you can still explore the uploads of others after every Bendigo event. Simply login to Livelox with your Eventor username/password and you can view routes of multiple people.

### Development of a Bendigo Bushwalking Guide book

For a long time I have wanted to share the joy of navigating in our local forests and woodlands with more people. Bendigo Orienteers is supporting a project to develop a Bendigo bushwalking guide book that will encourage people to get out in the bush and navigate their way around a walking route using small sections of orienteering maps.

There is a small partnership working group of some orienteering club members and several others from the local Australian Conservation Foundation community group who are developing and testing some walking route descriptions which we will compile with orienteering maps and photos and then hope to publish and print professionally.

Bendigo Orienteers will use this project as an opportunity to promote orienteering and encourage people to use maps to navigate in the local bushland area.

We have applied for a City of Greater Bendigo community grant of \$10,000 to cover the printing costs of getting 500 books printed. This project is consistent with the Council's health and wellbeing goals of getting more people exercising and spending time in the bush.

So far we have 12 draft walking routes drafted and hope to have about 30 in the book. Julie Flynn
