Our local orienteering season kicked off over the past month with some notable events and activities. Jim Russell delivered another successful season-opener Bendigo To-Day event using a new map of new terrain to the west of Inglewood. I think the event is best summarized by the comment of a South Australian orienteer who has attended most of the To-Day series over the years – "Best.To-Day.Ever".

Over the last weekend Julie Flynn ran the first of our two annual "Come and Try It" events on the Myers Creek map. Over 50 newcomers attended, making for a reasonably busy afternoon. We hope to see a few new faces at our regular events. Time will tell. A day later two teams of Bendigo Orienteers participated in the Victorian Relays held in Royal Park, Parkville. Both teams completed their courses without mispunching and achieving a second and third place. Mispunching was the order of the day.

The regular season of 5-course events starts this coming Saturday with an event near Lightning Hill, on the northern outskirts of Eaglehawk. Be prepared for a long leg on the two longest courses. Following that is the Easter carnival in South Australia. Twelve Bendigo Orienteers have entered. Good luck and accurate running for you all.

Come & Try It ... (by Julie Flynn)

We held our first Come & Try It event using the Myers Creek map in Kangaroo Flat on 16th March. We used the same maps and courses planned for the event which was cancelled in 2023 due to a Total Fire Ban.

At least 51 people attended the event and they chose either an easy or a moderate course. Most of these were family groups (parents with young children) or adult friends doing this in pairs. There were about 4 adult newcomers who came alone and went around their course independently. It was a joy to see the pleasure that a young man from the Philippines got from the event. This was his first experience in the bush and he loved seeing kangaroos for the first time.

Thanks to the following members who showed up to help: Jim Russell, Charles Brownridge, John Wilkinson, Nigel McGuckian, Neil Barr and Jenny Ball. The success of these events depends on having members there to help the newcomers.

We asked people after their course to rate their enjoyment and challenge out of 5 and whether they would attend again.

We used facebook to advertise this event and it worked well. This was the source of information reported by a large number of our newcomers.

Everyone reported high levels of enjoyment of their course and most found the challenge in their course not too difficult. No one got lost and they all stated they would like to come orienteering again. They were given information about the next 3 events and we are hoping to see some of them next Saturday at the event on Lightening Hill. If you see someone who looks like a newcomer, please introduce yourself to them and offer some assistance to help get them started.

There is another Come and Try event scheduled for Thursday 25 April, which is the Anzac Day holiday. Thank you Julie for organizing this event (Ed.).

Evan Great new map by dad, probably his best yet I reckon. Great courses by jimbo.




