

The start was at the Woodvale Recreation reserve that had toilets and a shelter. Competitors had to get as many controls in any order in one hour. The terrain included old mining, eroded gullies, open bushland and swamps (dry). Such variety always provides interest. 33 people competed – results are on Eventor under "Documents and Links". Michael Loughnan scored 160 pts in 51 minutes, followed by Don Cherry also 160 pts in 58 minutes. Third was Keely Williams who scored 150 pts in 56 minutes. Well done to everybody and thanks to Zac and James.



There are compasses and then there are other compasses...(or why your new compass may not work!)

Here's a story from Bendigo club member Julie Flynn.

A new member who has been enjoying orienteering is very keen to own a decent compass. So she bought one from a local store that sells compasses and other outdoors equipment.

Funny thing was that she couldn't get it to work properly in the store; the needle wouldn't set properly and remain pointing north when she rotated the compass. The salesperson suggested this was due to all the metal things in the store affecting the compass. He said it would work properly when she got it outside. So she purchased the compass and took it home.

The compass had its first orienteering outing last Saturday and it didn't perform as expected. The north needle didn't set and hold on north. It refused to sit horizontally as it should; the south needle consistently pointed downwards. She had unknowingly been sold a northern hemisphere compass...



This is how a northern hemisphere compass behaves in the southern hemisphere. The South needle points downwards......Likewise, a southern hemisphere compass performs similarly in the northern hemisphere, with the north needle tilting downwards.

When you purchase a compass to use here make sure to ask for a southern hemisphere compass. Most compasses are made for the northern half of the world because most people live there. The sales staff at local outdoors shops may not know that there are northern and southern hemisphere compasses.
