Hopefully the next scheduled event on March 29th at Browns Reef will go ahead – I am course setter. You will notice this year that course 1 is longer than usual (about 8 km). We also have the Australian Easter carnival of O events coming up soon (helpers are needed – contact Julie Flynn). Following Easter is the Anzac Day weekend which has the Victorian Middle, Long and sprint events. Bendigo O club is organising the Friday sprints (Dunolly) and Long distance event (Mt Korong). Merit badges from OA have been ordered for those people who requested one- we will pass them on when they arrive.

Mt Alexander and Mt Tarrengower origins



The origins of two of our popular orienteering areas – Mt Alexander and Mt Tarrengower are the subject of a talk by Professor Barry Golding at the Castlemaine Library in May. (See outline below.) Attendance is free, but bookings essential via Goldfields Libraries website.

If the ancient peaks of southern Dja Dja Wurrung country could speak, they'd no doubt tell remarkable stories like those in this significant new book by Professor Barry Golding, created in collaboration with Castlemaine-based geologist Clive William. The book bears witness to 'unsettling' changes over the past 200 years, as viewed from the perspective of the peaks (including Dharrang Gauwa - Mount Tarrengower and Liyanganyuk banyul - Mount Alexander) that stand sentinel over an ancient volcanic landscape and its immense natural and cultural significance.
